Learning Intention: Create a 3D image that represents yourself.







<p>Multistructural</p> 	<p>List: The main features about your face that you will include on your 3D face. Describe: Describe how you will show your features. What artistic medium will you use?</p>	
<p>Relational</p> 	<p>Explain: Why you have chosen some of the characteristics about yourself for your face. Eg “ I have used red for my hair because this represents the colour of my hair, or my eyes are this colour and shape. Apply: Draw a plan on paper or Seesaw of what your 3D face will look like. Write details about your face underneath your plan.</p>	
	<p>Create: Make your 3D face all about you by following the success criteria. Evaluate: Read your plan and decide whether you have done all that you were going to do or include in your 3D face artwork. What does 3D mean and what part of your artwork is 3D?</p>	
<p>Success Criteria</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> Your face must have 3 contrasting colours for the face, background and hair colour. You must add facial characteristics that make your artwork look like you. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Hair style and hair colour • Nose • Eyes • Mouth • Ears Evaluate whether it is the same as your plan Work carefully to create your “all about me” 3D artwork Keep working to make it your best work.
